Blue Zone Corner: Chairperson Sharon Lewis

At one of our recent meetings, Monique Doyle brought a Blue Zone favorite salad that everyone enjoyed. Here is her recipe. Enjoy

Confetti Coleslaw

3 cups each shredded green and purple cabbage

2 cups shredded carrots

1/2 cup scallions, green only

1/2 cup chopped celery

1 cup chopped cilantro

1/2 cup dried cranberries or mandarin oranges

1/2 cup toasted sliced almonds

Dressing:

3 T olive oil

2 T sherry or apple cider vinegar

1 T maple syrup

1 garlic clove minced or 1/2 t garlic powder.

Salt pepper to taste and pinch cayenne. optional.

Dress slaw and let it rest for 1 hour. Add almonds before serving. You can add chicken or use it for a topping for fish tacos.

Lindy Kowalczyk, Chairperson of Floral Design



Lindy Kowalczyk is chairperson of Floral Design in the category of Member Enrichment. Lindy fell and broke her shoulder in the fall, and she is grateful to Sue Oldershaw, Marianne Foley, Connie Lowery, and Jackie Purvis for filling in for our Club Floral Design seminars this season. Therefore, we are profiling all the floral design helpers along with Lindy. Sue Oldershaw was previously profiled.

Lindy is an artist and designer of jewelry. Previously she was an owner of Local Color Gallery, a Marco Island gallery with seven to 10 artists displaying their work. Lindy is an accredited NGC Flower Show Judge and enjoys working with other Flower Show Judges on Judges Council, as well as judging flower

shows given by other NGC garden clubs. Lindy is a member of the World Association of Flower Arrangers, and has been to

the WAFA meetings in Boston, Ireland, Barbados, and India (where she was a delegate). Lindy is also a member of Creative Flower Arrangers of the Americas (CFAA).

Lindy became a full-time resident of Marco Island in 2004. She spent most of her earlier life in the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania area and in Maryland, where she was a member of a garden club and where she raised her family. She taught school for a time after earning her masters' degree in learning disabilities, and while raising children Lindy did volunteer work in arts and crafts, and even coached high school softball. Later, she took graduate courses in art and has pursued artistic endeavors ever since.

Lindy is an avid gardener and enjoys growing different plants – including fruits and vegetables - from seed. As a floral designer and our Floral Design Chairperson, she is very proud that Calusa Garden Club members including the other floral designers in our club are trying new designs from the new National Federation of Garden Clubs Flower Show Handbook, such as the cascade grouped mass design.

Marianne Foley, Chairperson of Camperships and Scholarships, and Member of Floral Design Committee.



Marianne Foley, Chairperson of our Scholarship and Campership Committee, is also an accomplished floral designer and has presented floral design workshops this CGC year for our members in lieu of Lindy's injury. Marianne has had a seasonal condominium vacation home on Marco Island since 2004 and became a full-time resident in 2019 after her husband John passed away. She spent most of her earlier life in the Boston, Massachusetts area, where she was a member and president of a garden club in the western Boston area.

Marianne's career began as a school secretary, and while working full time she went to college full time to become a teacher. Her educational career included both teaching and school administration. From her love of teaching, Marianne became passionate about scholarships to assist students in pursuing their educational goals.

Marianne is passionate in all three of Calusa Garden Club's areas: gardening, floral design, and environmental protection. She has previously chaired CGC's Flowers in Public Places committee in addition to the Scholarship and Campership committee, and always volunteers for Club activities. In 2017, Marianne initiated and led an *ad hoc* committee to provide landscaping for Marco Island Academy (prior to the construction of the new MIA building). She organized and carried out the plan, including asking Naples Botanical Garden for donated plants and recruiting volunteers from the Club for a day of planting. The results were amazing and highly appreciated by the MIA staff and students. At Stephen's Landing, her condominium community, Marianne has planted several garden areas and is generous in giving plants to garden club members.

Jackie Purvis, Flower Show Judge and Floral Design Committee



Jackie Purvis is a member of the Floral Design Committee for the Club. Jackie came to Marco Island from Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, where she and her husband George purchased an old home in 1994 on 3/4 of an acre, where nothing had been done, inside or out, for about 25 years. She joined the Garden Club of Bala Cynwyd to learn about plants and trees and their care and transformed the garden over the years. In the Bala Cynwyd club, each member was required to enter the yearly Flower Show in horticulture and design. Also, the Garden Club in Bala Cynwyd entered the Philadelphia Flower Show every other year with a large design display - a back porch, an entryway, a window garden, and so forth. And, individuals from Jackie's club entered the

Philadelphia Flower Show every year in both Horticulture and Design. Jackie volunteered and entered the show for about 10 years. Regarding the Philadelphia Flower Show, Jackie says, "It was a joy. Everyone should see it at least once!"

In her first year at Bala Cynwyd, Jackie struggled through a petite design and won a red ribbon, and she was hooked on design. In addition, Jackie studied horticulture at the Barnes Foundation in Philadelphia for two years, and she and George always had a garden at their home until moving to a condo in Marco. She became an accredited Flower Show judge by NGC while a member of the Garden Club of Bala Cynwyd.

Jackie and George lived on Marco for ten years, and recently moved to Moorings Park, a Retirement Community in Naples. Jackie is originally from Hershey, PA, where she says, "Yes, one can smell the chocolate through the east windows, before a rain."
