MEET YOUR CALUSA GARDEN CLUB OFFICERS!

For this issue of *Smoke Signals,* we profile committee chairpersons of Awards -Opi DeFalco; Parliamentary Advisor-Linda Colombo and the committee chairpersons who grouped under Civic Beautification: Flowers in Public Places-Opi DeFalco; Memorial Markers and Arbor Day-Linda Colombo; and Special Projects- Sharon Lewis. Opi DeFalco is CGC's chairperson of Awards and Flowers in Public Places, as well as being a member of the Advisory Council as a CGC past president. Flowers in Public Places was started during Opi's Presidency in 2009, and she feels that it has become a wonderful advertisement for Calusa Garden Club, attracting new members and informing the public of our events. Opi is originally from Rockville Center, Long Island, New York. She and her husband, who is now deceased, lived there in their early marriage and then moved to many places including England, Upstate New York, Colorado, in her husband's career with IBM. She has one daughter, Danielle,

and one granddaughter, Sophia. They bought a vacation home on Marco Island in 1997 and visited often. In 2002, after 9/11 – which was very close to their home in NJ, they decided to sell their home in New Jersey and live full time on Marco. Opi's professional life primarily consisted of volunteer work, including Jr. Gardener programs, teaching art at an inner-city school, and volunteering at soup kitchens. For the last 10 years or more she has organized the volunteers from San Marco Catholic Church to serve at the Guadalupe Soup Kitchen in Immokalee.

As chairperson of Awards, Opi's job is to encourage our committee chairs to take the time and a little effort to apply for FFGC awards to recognize our hard work. Calusa GC and individual members have won many awards. Calusa has won for their flower shows, field trips, Blue Star Marker, Publicity, and many more. Check out Awards on the FFGC website. Opi says that applying for an award is easy, and that she is available to assist you.

Opi describes her love of gardening: "I have always loved gardening! When I was a child, I loved digging in the dirt and planting pansies and growing basil. I have had large vegetable gardens over the years and then became very interested in flower gardens and floral design here in Florida. When I joined Calusa Garden Club, I was asked to create a design for

the flower show. I had no idea what I was doing but with the help of several members I ended up receiving the top award! After that, I was hooked!"

Opi's advice for our Club members: "I have enjoyed being a member of Calusa for over 20 years. I have seen the Club grow and evolve and create many lasting friendships. We have strong leaders to take us forward for many years to come. If you have any questions, please ask me. I may not know the answer, but I can usually point you in the right direction."



Linda Colombo agreed to serve President Susan Neustadt as the Club's Parliamentarian, but since she is not a registered parliamentarian, she prefers that the position be called Parliamentary Advisor. Linda's working career included being a flight attendant for American Airlines for 34 years, and she also was a dental hygienist. Linda and her husband Russ moved to Marco Island in 1996 from Long Island, New York. Linda became active in community activities by serving on the Island's Beautification Committee and working with Friends of Tigertail Beach, of which she is currently serving as a two-term President.

Linda joined Calusa Garden Club 2007 and was our President from 2015-17. If you know Linda, you know she pitches in and gets things done! She began her CGC work as chair of Hospitality, and continued with the Blue Star Memorial, which became Memorial Markers when Linda realized the local markers were suffering from neglect and added the other markers to our care list. She initiated our Calusa.org website and serves as our webmaster. Linda worked with our Gardening Guide Committee to draft and publish our Gardening Guide and now works to promote and sell the Guide.

Linda is an avid gardener and enjoys different types of plants, with a special interest in native and Florida friendly plants. She invites all CGC members to come visit her yard—and says, "It is definitely not your typical Marco Island yard."



Sharon Lewis is the CGC Chairperson for Blue Zones Project, as well as the Chairperson for the Marco Towne Center plantings that is part of the Special Projects part of Civic Beautification. On Marco Island, Sharon is active in noontime Rotary, volunteers in the Parkinson's disease boxing and balance classes at the YMCA, and volunteers as an Audubon Owl Watcher. She visited Marco Island often with her husband, Howard, and they visited her brother and sister-in-law. After Howard passed away, Sharon purchased a condo on Marco. She has two children who live in San Diego and San Francisco.

Sharon was born in Rochester, New York, and because her father was in the military, Sharon lived in many European countries and many states in the U.S. during her school years, ending in Asmara Ethiopia, Africa, where she graduated from an international school before starting classes at Washington University in St. Louis. Next the family moved to St. Louis, Missouri, where Sharon attended classes at Washington University. She became a flight attendant with TWA Airlines in international routes, then later became employed at Siemens Corporation. While living in the D.C area, Sharon retired and began her volunteer career. She worked as a volunteer in the florist department of the WHITE HOUSE during the Clinton and Bush years. This enabled her to learn how to put together a variety of flower arrangements and to assist in decorating the White House for Christmas. This was a highlight and privilege of her retired career. Later Sharon used her skills developed at the White House and worked at a large garden center in Northern Virginia called Merrifield. She created large outdoor flower designs for their customers and from that work she developed her own clientele and own business.....and still takes care of those clients to date.

Sharon says she loves the camaraderie of Calusa Garden Club and enjoys all the strong and talented members of our Club. Her passion for floral design is evident in the designs she has created for our Flower Shows. Sharon takes charge of a project and sees it to its completion with dedication and vision. She also remarks that "I am fully engaged in the Blue Zones Project for Marco Island and was instrumental in getting our Calusa Garden Club as a recognized Blue Zone Club, as I am committed to their lifestyle principles."

Apple Squash Soup Recipe:

(1)Medium onion, (1) Butternut squash, peeled and quartered (6-8 cups), (1-2) large tart granny apple, chopped. Place all vegetables on sheet pan, toss with 2T olive oil. Pinch of nutmeg, cinnamon, cayenne, S&P. Roast 375 degree, 30 minutes until soft. Cool. Blender with 1 cup of water. Return to pot. Add 3 cups broth, 1 can of evaporated skim milk. Add more spices to taste. Simmer 20 minutes.
