One of Jennifer's healthy recipes is Pineapple Salsa:

- 1. ½ large firm avocado, cut in chunks
- 2. 1-1/2 cups diced pineapple
- 3. 1 cup peeled and diced kiwifruit
- 4. 1 red pepper, diced
- 5. ¼ cup finely diced red onion
- 6. 1 jalapeno, seeded and minced
- 7. **Finish**: ¼ Cup fresh cilantro and zest of 1 small lime.

Instructions: Put all of the first 6 ingredients in a small bowl and combine. Finish with ¼ cup fresh cilantro and zest of 1 small lime. Salt & pepper to taste.

Excellent to serve with fish, chicken or with chips.






SEPTEMBER: SAVE THE PLANTS AT BLUE STAR MEMORIAL
