They try to take time out of each day and sit on their lanai taking in the beauty of nature and the water views with Oscar at their side – de-stressing. A good practice for all of us. Their mantra is a" Healthy Life is a Happy Life".

Pictured standing next to containers of herbs and vegetables, they incorporate these in their daily meals. One of John's favorite easy appetizers are "Jalapeno Poppers."

This can be prepared as a Vegan appetizer or you can add some chopped meat as a variety.

#### Recipe

- 12 jalapeños, halved and deseeded
- 8 ounces of vegan cream cheese, or regular
- ½ lemon juice
- ½ cup of shredded cheddar cheese, or other cheese or your choice
- ¼ cup of chopped parsley, chives, and dill
- Minced garlic
- S&P
- Optional, panko crumbs

Mix all ingredients in a bowl. Spoon the mixture evenly in the jalapenos and place on a baking sheet. (optional -sprinkle with panko crumbs) Bake 15 - 20 minutes – 400 degree oven

# Basic Tips for Flower Arranging...

#### **MECHANICS**

Oasis: Float it holes side down until it sinks by itself. Do not push it down into water. Chicken Wire: It can be used alone or in conjunction with oasis when using large plant material. Tape: Clear tape to form grid especially on glass containers. Green tape to secure oasis. Kenzan: Pin holder, Secure to container with "Sure Stick". Container: Should complement arrangement, not dominate.

**TOOLS** 

Sharp Scissors (Joyce Chen) Clippers Wire Cutters

#### **CONDITIONING**

Make sure plant material is fresh. When cutting from your garden do this early or late in the day. Cut stems at an angle under water. Put plant material into buckets (which have been cleaned with bleach) with fresh water and plant preservative. Remove all leaves from stems which would be below the water line. Leave a few leaves at the top of stem to act as a siphon to bring the water up the stem. Conditioning time is usually 6-24 hours.

#### FLOWER ARRANGING TIPS

- 1. In general, the height of your tallest flower or stem should be 1.5 times the height of the container.
- 2. Experiment with color! Colors with high contrast such as yellows, purples and blues can make for a vibrant and exciting bouquet. Equally dramatic bouquets can be achieved using all different shades of the same color (monochromatic).
- 3. When choosing flowers for an arrangement, try to select a variety of shapes and sizes; it will make your arrangement more interesting. Graduating the sizes of the blooms give the eye some steppingstones from which to travel around the arrangement.
- 4. When cutting and putting your flowers into the arrangement, make sure to vary the heights. Keep the larger blooms toward the center as focal points. Smaller blooms should be used to create an outer line for your arrangement and fill in around your focal points.
- 5. Many people forget in important element in floral arranging to green or not to green? Foliage can be used to accent your flowers by creating a complimentary backdrop to show off their colors and forms. Foliage can also add different texture and create a line to your arrangement. Other times, however, it is best to leave the foliage out and let the flowers speak for themselves.


