Speaker for our November Meeting

The November program, presented by Dr. Steve Davis, is "Restoring America's Everglades Brings Resilience to South Florida."

Dr. Davis is The Everglades Foundation's Chief Science Officer. A native of Ohio, he earned a PhD from Florida International University in 1999 with research in Florida Bay and the coastal Everglades. Davis joined The Everglades Foundation in 2009 as a member of the Science Department, and he became a key voice in support of the organization's mission to restore America's Everglades. He draws upon his 25 years of Everglades science and teaching experience, including 10 years as professor of wetland ecology at Texas A&M University, to lead science, communication and outreach efforts focused on Everglades restoration, ecosystem health, and impacts of sealevel rise.

One month after a visit from Ian, volunteers from the Calusa Park Butterfly Garden Committee spent several hours in the garden. We surveyed the damage , weeded, and observed some signs of life in the garden as shown by the photo of a Watermelon Jatropha. Other survivors that were sprouting some new growth included passionvine, coontie, panama rose, powder puff tree, buttonwood, and necklace pod.

The porter weed is dead but left to hold the soil till we find a replacement plant. I also went to the Pineapple marker. All the bromeliads were dead except for the ornamental pineapple plants. When everyone gets their gardens squared away, we will need more ornamental since it works there and possibly sun loving ones. We will need sun loving for Leigh Plummer Marker as well. The Sand Hill marker looks good with blooming bromeliads and is visible from the bicycle path.

DECEMBER PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT from Kimberly Porter

Renowned Florida Nature Artist, John Costin, will present his work to the Calusa Garden Club on December 8th, 2022.

A resident of Ybor City (Tampa) Fl, John Costin has been a professional artist since 1979. His primary subject matter is birds which he has been fascinated by since childhood. His medium is intaglio printmaking which is a very old and complex process that allows him to show the viewer the tremendous detail and color that avian creatures possess. Starting with a graphite drawing that is transferred to a series of copper plates he creates an image on fine rag paper. Everything is done by hand; no computers or photography is ever used. When the piece is nearly completed, each one is meticulously painted by hand. Many of his bird subjects are depicted life size.

His work can be found in many local and private collections including Raymond James Financial, The State Library of Florida and the University of Miami. He recently completed a book project; "*Large Florida Birds*" containing 20 etchings of life size birds and their stories. The foreword for this book was written by Pulitzer Prize winning author, Jack E. Davis.

TRIP TO SELBY GARDEN from Sara Wolf

Fourteen members of Calusa Garden Club trekked to Sarasota on Tuesday, October 25 to visit Marie Selby Botanical Gardens and Museum. The Selby Gardens Orchid Show was being exhibited, and the orchids were also a feature of the Museum which exhibited macro photos of orchids in the Selby Gardens collection, greatly enlarged and printed on black backgrounds.



Selby Gardens' Manager of Visitor Engagement Ross Johnston conducted a tour of about an hour and a half. He talked about the history of Marie Selby Gardens, which originally was a home for Marie Selby and her husband Henry G. Selby. The couple purchased land on Sarasota Bay in 1921, built their home, and began planting many botanical specimens. Johnston highlighted the large banyan trees, the bamboo collection, the mangroves, and the native plants such as cycads before the group visited the greenhouse and the large orchid display.

Members enjoyed a boxed lunch in the shaded area of the gardens prior to the tour.
