Building our Butterfly Garden back after Hurricane Ian from Rhonda Gloodt



Our garden was left with only 30 percent of our plants recovering. The butterflies had no nectar or host plants left to return to. We did see a few butterflies fly through the yard in search of something! We quickly purchased a couple of flats of flowering Milkweed and a Balloon Milkweed and planted them. We have a Giant Milkweed that is recovering. Now the Monarch, Queen, and Soldier butterflies would have host and nectar plants to help them survive!

We have seen one White Peacock. Its host plants Water Hassop and Frog Fruit are doing OK but are not blooming. We have seen one Gulf Fritillary. Its' host plant is the Passion Vine which is doing well but is not currently in bloom. We have also seen a large Orange Barred Sulfur looking for its host and nectar plant the Popcorn Plant, unfortunately our plants were destroyed. And the ones we have planted from seed are very small. The butterflies that are here love the nectar from the Panama Rose and the beautiful blue flowers on the Golden Dewdrop, which now that it is the end of December, are full of flowers. We keep planting and are hoping for the return of the Zebra, Gold Rim Swallowtail, Giant Swallowtail and the Atala!

We also have seen an adorable hummingbird moth on the Panama Rose and have two outstandingly beautiful male Painted Buntings visiting our yard a couple of times a day!

Bonnie Colman and Marianne Foley instructed the participants before permitting them to begin and illustrated the lesson with a tree in the framework stage next to a finished tree. The workshop participants had a blast and learned how to trim foliage and flower stems correctly before inserting them into wet floral foam. The assistants circulated and assisted the participants by helping them insert stems in a pretty cone shape for their trees.
