BLUE ZONE Sweet Roasted Chickpeas—for the sweet tooth or a snack

15 ounce can of chickpeas, rinsed and drained.

- 1-2 tsp coconut oil
- 1-2 tsp of ground cinnamon
- 1-2 tsp of sugar or coconut sugar
- ½ tsp cayenne pepper
- 1 Tbsp of maple syrup or honey
 - 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees
 - 2. Rinse and pat dry chickpeas
 - 3. In a bowl combine all oil and spices (not maple syrup)
 - 4. Add chickpeas onto a sheet pan.

Lined with foil. 5 Bake for 25-30 min – stirring, until golden brown. 6 ADD maple syrup for an addition 5 minutes. Delicious and healthy.

On Friday, January 20, Calusa Garden Club held a tree planting ceremony in Leigh Plummer Park where the Club planted a gumbo limbo tree. The Club has celebrated Florida Arbor Day, which was January 20, for the past 6 years by planting a native Florida tree in Leigh Plummer Park. This park was chosen by the Club because the park was originally founded by Collier County in 1984 with the assistance of Calusa Garden Club of Marco Island as a bird sanctuary and site for

nature education featuring native Florida plants. Over the years, first Collier County, and now the city of Marco Island, planted many native trees and shrubs in the park. The park is a living memorial to Leigh Plummer, a Marco Island resident who was instrumental in the work of Marco Island Civic Association. His wife was a member of Calusa Garden Club and she and Leigh Plummer enjoyed tending to the plantings in the park.

The Florida Arbor Day event was chaired by Club member Nanette Baumgardner. The gumbo limbo tree planting ceremony was attended by Marco Island Assistant City Manager Casey Lucius, and Jill Cartaya, Dawn Snyder, Martha Montgomery and Heather Reed of the Department of Parks and Recreation, along with about twenty members of Calusa Garden Club in addition to Erik Jadaszewski and the tree planting crew from Everglades Native Designs. City Manager Michael McNees and County Commissioner Darren Palumbo also attended the event and are pictured with other attendees near the newly planted gumbo limbo tree.

January 23 Floral Design Workshop. Underwater Designs

Floral Design chairman Lindy
Kowalczyk presented an educational and
fun workshop on underwater designs on
Monday, January 23. Nine CGC
members attended. Lindy began by
talking about the principles and elements
and of design, and showed a partially
finished design for which she analyzed
those principles and elements. She also
discussed the requirements for judging an



underwater design and showed photos fitting those requirements. Finally, Lindy discussed the problems of mechanics with underwater designs and the types of flowers that work well.

Lindy then showed the group several flowers and greens she had wired together in an artful arrangement. She showed how to place the design in the container and add other elements. Care must be taken to fasten every element, so it does not float when the water is added. Finally, she showed how to add additional design elements above the water that complemented the underwater elements. The pouring of the distilled water into the container is the last step, and it should be done slowly.

The members then worked on their own designs with assistance of Lindy, Bonnie Colman and Marianne Foley. The photo shows their completed designs.
